Civil Rights Policy Statement

It is the policy of the Victor Association of Cultural and Performing Arts AKA Cobblestone Arts Center to prevent and to eliminate discrimination in all of its operations and services as well as all aspects of employment. The Cobblestone Arts Center shall plan, develop, and implement their programs, services, and activities so that no person is subjected to unlawful discrimination based on race, creed, color, gender, age, national origin, religion, disability, sexual orientation, marital status, veteran status, or Vietnam-era veteran status. The policy fully incorporates throughout all of Cobblestone's operations the requirements of applicable Federal laws and executive orders to prohibit any discriminatory practices, procedures, and policies. All administrators, managers, supervisors, and employees are directed to comply with these laws and orders. Cobblestone has a standard process for investigating complains of alleged violations of Title VI. Members of the public may file a signed, written complain within 180 days from the date of the alleged discrimination. The Cobblestone Arts Center has developed a Title VI complaint procedure to help ensure that no person (in the State of New York) be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program administered by Cobblestone Arts Center. Complains must be directed in writing (please see Complain of Discrimination form), signed by the person(s) or their representative and must include the complainant(s) name, address, and telephone number to: Emily Wojcik (contact information below).

Cobblestone Arts Center is committed to maintaining a work environment free from all forms of discrimination, where the individual dignity of each employee is respected. We are committed to a policy of Equal Employment Opportunity with respect to all employees and applicants for employment.
